All Councillors have had time to study the budget as agreed in the meeting on 16th January. Issues at Bedwas Workmen's Hall were discussed, including possible emergency repairs and the importance of it staying open for our community. Chair of Finance Cllr Morgan proposed an increase in the precept of 7.5%. This is an increase of £1.94 per year for a Band D household. 4/ Alternative funding

Cllr Morgan has looked at options for borrowing money from the Central Government for work at Bedwas Workmen's Hall if required. There are applications currently being made for outside funding from National Lottery which will secure the future of the Hall. No further action to be taken until the result of the Lottery Bid is known

5/ Bedwas Workmen's Hall

Quotes have been received for emergency repairs to the roof at Bedwas Workmen's Hall. There is currently significant water ingress, through 4 separate places in the roof, causing structural damage. The costs of these temporary repairs is prohibitive, and alternative options are being explored until funding is available for the complete refit. BTM CC understands the importance of Bedwas Workmen's Hall in the community. It currently supports 25 local small business who hire spaces every week. The Hall has always been at the heart of the community and needs to be maintained and made accessible to all to ensure it stays so
