#### **BEDWAS WORKMEN'S HALL**

Phipps Magill (Co Chair) presented a monthly update from BWH. Outgoings for the period 24 January to 24 February were: Electricity upstairs £27, Downstairs £349. Gas £1,550, Water £337, Licences £420 and PAT testing £507. The application for Lottery Funding has been submitted. A decision is expected first week in June. With the Hall celebrating its Centenary Year there are lots of events planned. Volunteers are all working very hard.
